He had recovered spontaneously by the time I arrived but was still light-headed when he tried to sit up. ECGs - no acute or evolving changes. He had a history of MI and previous PTCS+stents, also of multiple PEs and had recently been diagnosed with NIDDM. He was conveyed to Morrision without my needing to escort him.

L carpal spasm. No response to naloxone. Plan was to convey with me escorting to Morrision but 67 deployed to recreation ground nearby so I only had to take him a short distance by which time he was GCS 8. EMRTS took over in case he deteriorated.

Initially thought that patient had stabbed himself in abdomen. at scene patient looked grey and clammy. small superficial abdominal wound. patient stated that he had been feeling ill all day, and that the laceration to abdomen was accidental. Transpires he was 12 years abstinent from opiates, and had taken 30 mg DHC x 8 the night before (17 hours before) had awoken this morning with nausea and vomiting .</p> <p>Counselled at length</p> <p>No suicidal ideation</p> <p>Full capacity.</p> <p>advised we would like him to travel to UHW, refused adamantly.</p> <p>Haemodynamically stable (Pulse 60 BP 108 systolic)</p> <p>abdomen soft, would not allow auscultation to determine bowel sounds, but assured me he had passed flatus.</p> <p>Worsening advice given to patient and friend. open access review with 999.</p> <p>This was a very difficult scenario. Ultimately the patient had full capacity and we had to respect his wishes.</p>
