						<i>Additional comments:</i> The male driver had been said to have blacked out at the wheel. He had not sustained any significant injury but his passenger was complaining of low cervical/high thoracic midline pain with no neurology and low sternal/sub-sternal pain Her respiratory rate was very elevated. Examination and review of observations. There was no evidence of significant injury and her respiratory rate settled to 16-20/min without interventions. She was given appropriate analgesia and taken to local hospital. Both casualties conveyed without my needing to escort.

						<i>Additional comments:</i> the casualty had jumped head first out of a first floor window. Initial SpO2 reported to be 87% and blood noted from L ear. Primary survey. Closed head injury (?basal skull #). GCS initially 5-6 recovering to 12 in EA. # L clavicle and humerus/elbow. Likely pneumothorax but maintaining own airway and SpO2 recovered to 98%+ with O2 Liaison with Trauma Desk. Escorted casualty to Morrision

	<i>Additional comments:</i>					<p>A vehicle had collided with another two vehicles on a street with a nominal speed limit of 30mph although it was alleged that the casualty's vehicle had been travelling at a speed in excess of this.</p> <p>Airbags deployed and wearing seatbelt.</p> <p>Primary survey. Noted fluctuating GCS (best=14) and pinpoint pupils.</p> <p>Possible injuries to R chest and abdomen but casualty was haemodynamically stable and ultrasound was negative for pneumothorax/fluid in abdo.</p> <p>Improved verbal responses/GCS and pupil diameter post naloxone</p> <p>Handover to H67</p> <p>Casualty conveyed to Morriston without needing escort.</p> <p>Two others involved in incident checked by H67 personnel and no significant injuries detected.</p>
